Jennifer Gates and I went along to the prison on Wednesday 26th of April for a very enjoyable lunch of soup and bread followed by tea or coffee which the prisoners cooked and served in order to support this charity (<https://www.marysmeals.org.uk/>) whose aim is to feed and educate children in the poorest areas of the world.

As of 24th April 2017 - Mary's Meals is now reaching more than 1.2 million of the world's poorest children with a nutritious daily meal in school.

The prison are hoping to host this event twice a year and when they let me know the details of their next event (in about six months time), I will try to ensure that everyone is informed and arrange car sharing if necessary for anyone who wishes to attend.

HMP KIRKHAM FARM SHOP

The farm shop at the entrance to the prison is open daily (8am - 5pm Monday to Friday; 8am - 3pm Saturday and 10am - 3pm Sunday). They sell the **fresh produce from their farm (vegetables and eggs)** as well as **locally produced milk & butter**. They also sell **bacon** and prepared cuts of meat (**beef; lamb; pork**) from home reared animals and at certain times it is also possible to order prepared meat for your freezer. They bake and sell **bread**. They also sell **Jams, chutneys** as well as **some other fruits and vegetables** which are bought in.

Also on sale are a range of sheds, wrought iron work, wooden planters, garden furniture, fencing, bird boxes, bird feeders etc. which are produced by the prisoners.

(Please note: The Prison is not allowed (due to constraints place on them by local businesses) to advertise their shop, other than by the notice which is place just outside the entrance to the prison when the shop is open - so they are totally unaware of this notice for which I am solely responsible (Eve).)

Please when planning your shopping, as they do so much for us as a Church, give a thought to supporting them.
